Course overview

The seminar discusses recent empirical research in the area of managerial accounting and performance measurement.

Course objectives

Understanding and doing cutting edge empirical research in managerial accounting and performance measurement. The objective of the course is to develop your ability to critically evaluate and conduct archival and survey-based empirical research on performance measurement and compensation issues. In particular, you should get (1) an appreciation for important contemporary research topics in these areas, (2) an understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of common research designs, and (3) the necessary skills to design and conduct empirical research on performance measurement and compensation topics.







Course prerequisites

Business Administration for Research Students: Theory I and II recommended.

Exams and Grading

Graded coursework assignment.

Course content

The seminar provides a comprehensive presentation of selected papers dealing empirically with question related to the design and implementation of performance measurement and compensation systems. A current topic list and a detailed time line will be made available on the course web page (OLAT).
