Exams and Grading

Each participating doctoral student has to presents a summary of an assigned research paper. The grading will be based on the quality of a presentation including the quality of the presentation slides as well as in the individual contributions to the class discussion.

We expect class attendance during the complete seminar. Students who miss part of the class without approval by the course organizers will receive an insufficient grade.

Course content

The seminar is organized in three parts:

- Part I (Day 1): Seminar instructors provide a comprehensive presentation of selected research topics in the area of analytical accounting research
- Part II (Day 2): Students present summaries of research papers related to the topics covered in part I
- Part III (Day 2): Students present their own research projects

The current topic list will be made available on the course web page (OLAT) no later than April 30.
