Course overview

The seminar discusses classical and recent research articles in the area of transfer pricing and provides a comprehensive overview of transfer pricing for managerial and tax purposes.

Course objectives

The course provides a thorough understanding of some apparent managerial and taxation problems in transfer pricing and enables students to evaluate the usefulness of different transfer pricing methods as well as potential conflicts of interest among transfer pricing objectives.

Course prerequisites

Completed BA degree in economics or business administration

Exams and Grading

The grading will be based on the quality of the presentation including the quality of the presentation slides for the presentation topic, the preparation and the conduct of





the class discussion for the discussion topic, and the individual contributions to the general class discussion. The individual elements are weighted as follows:

- Quality of the slides and the presentation (70 %)
- Quality of discussion (20 %)
- Quality of contributions to class discussion (10 %)
- Total (100 %)

We expect a regular class attendance. Students who miss classes without prior explanation and approval by the course organizers will receive an insufficient grade.
